TO THE COLYTON GRAMMAR SCHOOL PARENTS' ASSOCIATION

WHAT CAN THE PARENTS' ASSOCIATION DO FOR YOU?

If you think back to how you met people at your child's primary school, it was probably in the playground or at the school gate. But that opportunity does not exist at secondary school. Very quickly your child will make new friends at school with parties and sleepovers being arranged and confirmed by text or email! But what about the parents? How do you get to know one another? This is where the PA can help.

YEAR 7 NEW PARENTS' TEA

In your New Parents Information Pack you will receive an invitation to an afternoon tea jointly hosted by the Headteacher and the PA. We started this in 2010 and it has proved very popular with new parents.

It takes place in the Cottrill Hall in the first week of the new school year. On arrival, you will be handed a badge in the house colour of your child's tutor group - blue for Ash, green for Beech, yellow for Cedar, purple for Elm and red for Oak - so that you can easily identify and meet fellow parents. There will also be members of the PA committee, a few sixth-formers and Form Tutors, if available. So it is a great opportunity to chat informally with other parents, the Headteacher and other teachers as well as finding out a bit more about the school.

Class list: Due to data protection laws, this is something the school cannot provide, so the PA volunteers to collect contact details from new Yr 7 parents which they then circulate within that tutor group. It is entirely up to you if you want to be involved, but most parents find it very useful. Your child will most likely make friends with others in the same tutor group and having their parents' contact details will be very useful in the first year or so.

Members of the PA committee will also be at the New Yr 7 Students & Parents Induction in June, manning the second-hand uniform stand as well as being available to answer questions or give information about any of our events and activities. We will be easily identifiable by name badges so please do not hesitate to ask if we can help in any way.

The second-hand uniform stand has a wide selection of all the uniform and sports kit needed for CGS. Prices are very reasonable and all money raised goes directly into PA funds.

PA MEETINGS

THE CGSPA BOOK CLUB

The PA began the Book Club in 2011 and it has gone from strength to strength.

WHAT DOES THE PA DO FOR THE SCHOOL & STUDENTS

Colyton Grammar School is an outstanding school where students are taught by dedicated teachers in well-equipped classrooms, language suites and laboratories. But in these straitened economic times, the PA helps to provide some of the extras that the school budget is unable to cover.

Our **Space4Science** appeal concluded in Summer 2017 having successfully raised **£100,000** for the total conversion and refurbishment of a new science lab.



In recent years the PA was very pleased to be able to contribute £22,000 to the furnishing and equipping of the new Music Centre including musical instruments. We have contributed to many other projects including the last refurbishment of the Library and the Art Centre, we have provided digital cameras for Art, Raspberry Pi computers and robotics equipment for IT, new sports vests and rugby shirts for PE and regular year 8 First Aid Courses. Recently we have contributed £20,000 towards the updating of the School's IT infrastructure and expanding the existing data storage.

In 2014 the PA paid the full £19,000 to secure a new minibus. We have paid for the very popular outdoor table tennis tables, equipment for Duke of Edinburgh's Awards, iPads for PE and contributed to the new 3D printer. All these contributions facilitated by PA fundraising and the generosity of parents make a very real difference to the school and students.

All proceeds from our events go towards raising money for the school for the benefit of our children's education. It is very rewarding to work together and new parents are particularly welcomed to help in any way they can.

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EVENTS

Along with raising money, we also organise events to help contribute to the richness of school life. You do not have to wait until your child starts CGS in September, please come along to our events this summer! This will really help your children get used to the school layout and give you the opportunity to meet other parents.

The Garden & Food Festival

This is an annual event held every May since 2003. The School is transformed for the day into an amazing gardening and food market. There are a variety of local food producers and craft stalls as well as the specialist nurseries. There are also the added attractions of a BBQ, cream teas, raffle, tombola, music entertainment by the students and a children's activity area. Second-hand uniform will also be on sale. Last year the Garden & Food Festival raised £6600.

Summer Fête

Every year the students hold a Summer Fête with stalls, entertainment and games predominantly run by the younger students. The PA supports the event by organising and running a café, cake stall, ice cream and soft drinks stand, book stall and a BBQ. There is also another opportunity to shop at our second-hand uniform stall. With some 70+ stalls this is not to be missed.

Summer Draw

New for 2018! We plan to build on the success of our Winter Draw and have a major raffle for the summer term. This will be launched at the Garden & Food Festival in May and will run through to the final ticket draw at the Summer Fête. We plan to have major prizes, such as luxury Spa Days etc, and hope that it will be as successful at our Winter Draw.

Festive Evening

A popular Christmas showcase in December organised by the PA in conjunction with the Director of Music, Mr House. Talented students entertain an audience of family and friends with a mixture of music, dance and song. The evening is set up in cabaret style with tables and refreshments. Tickets always sell out quickly!

Winter Draw

In the autumn term the PA holds a Grand Winter Draw with top prizes such as a B&O speaker, dining vouchers for The Pig @ Coombe, a Fortnum & Mason hamper, vouchers etc. This is drawn at the Festive Evening and generally raises in the region of £2500.

The Silent Auction

Our own online auction is held every other year in the spring, the most recent being 2018. The auction lots have been exciting and varied including holiday lets, flight simulator experiences, tours of the Met Office, tickets to matches/theatres, cooking courses, a carriage ride, a champagne tea at Lords, and an animation workshop. The last Silent Auction raised £3333.

The Big Colyton Art Show

This major event launched in 2015 and runs every other year in the autumn term. It is a weekend exhibition and sale of art from professional artists and Colyton students. There is also an online catalogue. Over £100k of art is on show and a shop selling smaller items. There are workshops, student art and a café too. At the inaugural show we raised £11k and in 2016 over £12k. The next show will be in October 2018.
